The school counseling department encourages parents and guardians to stay informed about your child's school progress as we hit the long months of winter. Remember to:

- Ask your student about homework every night instead of saying, "Do you have any homework?"- ask: "What's your homework tonight?" Encourage them to use their planner to keep track of assignments. Have them show you their Google classrooms and look for any unfinished or not submitted work.
- Check your PowerSchool Parent Portal to see up-to-date grades. Encourage your child to check their own grades on Student Portal. Look for zeroes or incomplete work.
- Have your student get extra help during Reach or before/after school if they are struggling with a certain subject.
- · Stay in touch with teachers and counselors if you have questions or concerns.


