Winter Workings at NEMS

With the arrival of the cold weather, it is important that parents and students are prepared. NEMS is an old and drafty building. In some rooms, the heat works overtime. In other rooms, the radiators struggle to make any impact at all. It works best if students have multiple layers of clothing. In one of the colder rooms, they may need a sweatshirt or a sweater. Students who arrive before then have to stay outside as there is nobody on duty to watch them. Please make sure your child is not arriving too early.

Please make sure you continue to monitor your child's grades in Powerschool. Reach out to their teachers and Guidance if you see any issues.

If you are considering getting something for your young musician for the upcoming holidays, please beware of ISOs! These are relatively inexpensive Instrument-**S**haped **O**bjects, often purchased online or at discounted retailers. These instruments may look like traditional band instruments, but are poorly made, don't play well, are out of tune, and break very easily. When they break, repair specialists will not fix them because they don't want to be liable for the trouble that would ensue. If you would like to invest in an instrument for your child, please contact me. I'm happy to give suggestions in various price ranges. A good local source is The Music Shop of Southington and on-line is WoodwindBrasswind.com.

In my opinion, the best gift for your young musician would be private lessons. Your child will be able to make great progress with the help of a specialist. Again, I'm happy to offer suggestions. Other ideas include valve oil, slide oil, reeds, a music stand, and fun sheet music. At The Music Shop, you can have your young musician's favorite song from the radio, TV or the movies printed out for your child's instrument.

Thank you for supporting your child in his or her musical development. Your encouragement and compliments are the most powerful motivator you can give your child! Please consider starting a family tradition of having your child play their instrument when you gather for celebrations. My family did mini concerts between dinner and dessert on Christmas Eve and over the years my 3 brothers and I got so much positive feedback from everyone it motivated us to play our best.

GREEN TEAM SERVICE PROJECT



With the cold and flu season upon us, the Bristol-Burlington Health District would like to remind families of some ways to keep children and school staff healthy:

-If your child has a fever greater than 100 degrees they must stay home. The child needs to be fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medications before returning to school.


-If your child has vomiting or diarrhea they must stay home. They should have no vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school.

-If your child has a continuous runny nose and is not able to blow and wipe their nose independently, please keep them home.

-If your child has a continuous cough and cannot properly cover their mouth, please keep them at home.

If you have any questions or concerns, feel free to contact your school nurse.

The homework bus available for students staying after school for academic help on Tuesday and Thursday. The bus leaves NEMS at 4:00pm and students must sign up by 10:00am in the office on the day they need a ride.



Students and/or parents must make arrangements ahead of time with the teachers with whom they want to stay after school. The bus is paid for out of a grant which means it is only for kids staying for academic help. It is not for students staying for sports or activities and it is limited to the first 20 kids who sign up each day.
