8th grade parents and students: Believe it or not, it's already time to think about options for high school! We had presentations from both EC Goodwin Technical High School and Southington High School's Agriculture-Science Program in late October and early November.

### **Homework Club**

Starting on November 14th, there will be a homework club every Tuesday and Thursday morning from 7:15 A.M.-7:45 A.M. Students will need to be at the front door at 7:15 A.M. They will be escorted into the building by a staff member. Another staff member will wait at the front door until 7:20 to pick up any stragglers. Any student that arrives after 7:20 A.M. will not be let in. To start out, the club will be open to all students but, if the numbers get too high, we will have students sign up the day before. We hope to have 20 students access the club each day.

### **Homework Bus**

Starting on November 28th, NEMS will have a homework bus available for students. The bus will leave NEMS at 4:00 P.M. and students must sign up by 10:00 A.M. on the day they need a ride. The bus will run every Tuesday and Thursday. Students and/or parents must make arrangements ahead of time with the teachers with whom they want to stay after school. The bus is paid for out of a grant which means it is only for kids staying for academic help. It is not for students staying for sports or activities. It is limited to the first 20 kids who sign up each day.



We need some help getting students to school prepared and on time. Make sure they have all their materials and supplies and are ready to get out the door in the morning.

Check their planners and put their materials out. Chromebooks, instruments, and water bottles are the items forgotten most often. Please plan ahead for the line of cars that gets longer on the cold or stormy days. Anything you can do to make sure they get here on time would be much appreciated.

### Notes from the Band Room

What a pleasure it was to meet so many band families at Conferences! It was great to get to tell you how your child is progressing. For those of you who weren't able to attend, here are a few things we talked about.

In PowerSchool, the grade you see for band is primarily a participation grade. If a student does not come prepared with their instrument and/or music, they earn 5/10 points. Students who are prepared and actively participating earn full credit, which is 10 points.

At every student's lesson, they are asked to perform something of my choice from the assignment they gave themselves at the previous lesson. The lesson score is the grade earned individually by that performance.

I have been teaching students how to practice as well, and we have talked about the challenge and opportunity of making ourselves practice regularly. Here are some of the suggestions I've made to your musician for good practicing.

- Make sure you are sitting up properly and using a music stand to hold your lesson book.
- Each line you assign yourself should be played several times each day, and each time you practice it, have a different goal in mind. Maybe try playing it for perfect counting and foot tapping, and then for the right notes and key signature, then next time for good articulation. Then, play with the dynamics that are written. If these terms are unfamiliar, ask your child what they mean.
- Make sure to end your practice session with a song you love to play!
